Judicial Circuit, being duly sworn on his/her oath (or having affirmed), says that in
Marion County, Indiana

COUNT I

On or about May 31, 2020, Deion Gray did knowingly or intentionally touch
MICHAEL T BEVER, a public safety official, in a rude, insolent, or angry manner by
striking him, while the said official was engaged in the official's official duty;

COUNT II

On or about May 31, 2020, Deion Gray did knowingly or intentionally forcibly
resist, obstruct or interfere with DANIEL AARON REED, a law enforcement officer;
and/or MICHAEL THOMAS GRABAN , a law enforcement officer; and/or MICHAEL T
BEVER, a law enforcement officer; and/or SPENCER MICHAEL DIERSING, a law
enforcement officer; and/or STEVEN JAMES EGNATOFF, a law enforcement officer;
and/or ZANE M HENNIG, a law enforcement officer; while said officer was lawfully
engaged in his duties as a law enforcement officer and in committing said act the
defendant inflicted bodily injury on or otherwise caused bodily injury to DANIEL
AARON REED, to-wit: pain, and/or laceration(s);

COUNT III

On or about May 31, 2020, Deion Gray did knowingly or intentionally forcibly

resist, obstruct or interfere with MICHAEL THOMAS GRABAN, a law enforcement officer; and/or DANIEL AARON REED, a law enforcement officer; and/or MICHAEL T BEVER, a law enforcement officer; and/or SPENCER MICHAEL DIERSING, a law enforcement officer; and/or STEVEN JAMES EGNATOFF, a law enforcement officer; and/or ZANE M HENNIG, a law enforcement officer; while said officer was lawfully engaged in his duties as a law enforcement officer and in committing said act the defendant inflicted bodily injury on or otherwise caused bodily injury to MICHAEL THOMAS GRABAN, to-wit: abrasion(s) and/or a scratch, and/or pain;

all of which is contrary to statute and against the peace and dignity of the State of Indiana.

PROBABLE CAUSE AFFIDAVIT

Defendant Name: Deion Gray

Arresting Officer / ID: Michael Graban/41692

On 05/31/2020 at approximately 2:10 am Officer M. Graban of the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department was working at the intersection of Delaware and Market St. during the riots that were occurring, with Mobile Field Force. Control notified officers that there was a person shot at the intersection of Market and Pennsylvania, one block west of the officers location. Officers went to the person shot on foot to assist.

As Officers were arriving, Officer Daniel Reed was in front of Officer Graban. Officer Graban observed a black male approach Officer Reed and swing at Officer Reed, then attempted to grab Officer Reed causing him to fall back into a light pole. Officer Graban and Officer M. Bever grabbed the male and attempted to detain the male but the male began swinging closed fist punches at both officers and was attempting to get away from them. Officer Bever was struck in the face by a close fist punch during this. Officers were able to deliver multiple strikes back on the individual and push him into the building, Officer Graban then was able to pull the male to the ground from behind. The male was later identified as Deion Gray. Once on the ground, Mr. Gray continued to resist officers using strong powerful and violent means by pulling away and still attempting to swing at the Officers, despite Officers telling him to stop resisting. By this time Officer Diersing, Officer Hennig, and Officer Egnatoff assisted Officer Graban and Officer Reed in getting the male in handcuffs, which took the efforts of all officers utilizing weight leverage to gain control of Mr. Grays arms. All forced ceased once Mr. Gray was in custody. During the altercation multiple rioters were throwing rocks and utilizing slingshots to shoot screwdrivers at the Officers.

During the altercation, Officer Graban had a minor abrasion to his left elbow, a scratch that was bleeding on his left inside forearm, and an abrasion to the right side of his chin. Officer Reed had two minor cuts that were bleeding on his face, above his eye and on his nose. No other Officers had apparent injuries. Mr. Gray was immediately placed in a wagon and transported to intake. All events occurred in Marion County, Indianapolis Indiana.
