The following facts and information subscribed and sworn to before me this date: August 08, 2022

On August 07, 2022 at approximately 23:55 while on duty in the County of Henry, State of Indiana, I, Deputy Gregg Yuknavage, conducted a traffic stop on I-70 Eastbound at the 125 Mile Marker on a white GMC Acadia bearing Indiana Registration 702NE for failing to use a turn signal to signal a lane change and straddling the white lane divider. While on routine patrol, Henry County Dispatch relayed that they received a call that a white GMC Acadia with a license plate reading 702NE was traveling eastbound on I-70 from the 104 mile marker at 45 mph. I was sitting stationary in the median at the 120 mile marker watching eastbound traffic when a white GMC Acadia passed me in the left lane with a large group of vehicles behind it in both lanes. I pulled out into the eastbound lanes and caught up to the vehicle, which was now in the right lane, east of the 123 exit. The vehicle was traveling under the speed limit and was being passed by tractor-trailers. I witnessed the vehicle begin to straddle the white lane divider as a tractor-trailer was passing. When the left lane was empty, the driver of the vehicle turned on the right turn signal and immediately began to switch to the left lane. The vehicle's right turn signal turned off and the vehicle started to move back into the majority of the right lane. I witnessed the vehicle straddling the white lane divider until I activated my emergency red and blue lights at the 125 mile marker sign. The vehicle yielded to my lights but took a considerable amount of time to pull over to the right shoulder.

Upon making contact with the driver, Michael Renfro Jr., I could smell the odor commonly associated with alcohol coming from the vehicle. I know the odor commonly associated with alcohol because of my experience as a law enforcement officer. I explained to Mr. Renfro Jr. the reason for the stop and he apologized. I asked Mr. Renfro Jr. where he was going and he told me "Beech Grove." I asked Mr. Renfro Jr. if he knew what direction he was going in at that time and he told me "south." I explained to Mr. Renfro Jr. that I-70 runs east to west, and he was already east of Indianapolis. I asked Mr. Renfro Jr. if he had consumed any alcohol and he started to cry and admitted to having "a couple" drinks. Mr. Renfro Jr. asked me if he could call his wife and pick him up. I then asked Deputy N. Lockwood to come to my traffic stop as I searched the license plate and Mr. Renfro Jr.'s driver's license through INBMV.

Deputy Lockwood then arrived shortly after and I asked Mr. Renfro Jr. to step out of the vehicle and walk back to between his vehicle and my commission. I patted Mr. Renfro Jr. down for weapons for officer safety and asked him if he would participate in Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFST's) to which he consented. Before I could explain the instructions to the HGN Test, Mr. Renfro Jr. leaned against the rear of his vehicle and started crying and told Deputy Lockwood and myself that he is a basketball coach and gym teacher at Beech Grove High School and asked me not to post this in the news. During the HGN Test, Mr. Renfro Jr. showed 4/6 clues (distinct and sustained nystagmus in both eyes and onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes). I then explained the instructions for the Walk and Turn Test and Mr. Renfro Jr. said that he understood. Mr. Renfro Jr. showed 3/8 clues (can't balance during instructions, starts too soon, and steps off the line). Mr. Renfro Jr. stepped off of the line

on the first step then refused to complete the test. I then explained the instructions for the One Leg Stand Test and Mr. Renfro Jr. refused to attempt the test because "a sober person couldn't even do it." I then asked Mr. Renfro Jr. if he would submit a breath sample into a preliminary breath test (PBT) and he consented. Deputy Lockwood then returned to his commission to retrieve his PBT. While gone, I read Mr. Renfro Jr. his Miranda Warning verbatim from my department issued notepad. Mr. Renfro Jr. said that he understood his rights. Deputy Lockwood returned with his PBT and Mr. Renfro Jr. submitted a breath sample of .240. I then placed Mr. Renfro Jr. into handcuffs behind his back and requested a wrecker from Henry County Dispatch, to which Affordable Towing responded. I then read Mr. Renfro Jr. his Implied Consent Warning verbatim from my department issued notepad and he agreed to take a chemical test. As I was placing Mr. Renfro Jr. into the front passenger seat of my commission, Deputy Lockwood began searching Mr. Renfro Jr.'s immediate area of his vehicle. Deputy Lockwood said that he found a folded dollar bill on the driver floorboard between the driver's seat and floor mat. Because of Deputy Lockwood's training and experience as a law enforcement officer, he knew that dollar bills are a common way to conceal illegal narcotics. Deputy Lockwood then unfolded the dollar bill and found a white powdery substance in the center. Deputy Lockwood then walked over and asked Mr. Renfro Jr. what the substance was. Mr. Renfro Jr. hesitated then said "either cocaine or meth." I then transported Mr. Renfro to Henry Community Health while Deputy Lockwood searched the rest of his vehicle. Deputy Lockwood tested the white substance in the folded dollar bill with a Nartec Inc. Cocaine Test ampule. The white end of the ampule turned blue after being touched to the white substance, giving a positive indication for cocaine. Deputy Lockwood located \$50 in cash, a \$100 casino coin, and various clothes in the vehicle. \$327 was also later found on Mr. Renfro Jr.'s person.

While in route to Henry Community Health, Deputy Lockwood called and told me he found multiple small baggies of a white substance along with multiple folded dollar bills under the driver's floor mat. I later asked Mr. Renfro Jr. where he was coming from and he told me that he was coming from the bar he owned on the south side of Indianapolis. I asked Mr. Renfro Jr. what all he drank and he said "a couple Crowns." Mr. Renfro Jr. and I arrived at Henry Community Health at 00:30 and he had his blood drawn at 01:00. I then transported Mr. Renfro Jr. to the Henry County Jail.

Michael Renfro Jr. was booked into the Henry County Jail for the following offenses:

- Dealing in Cocaine or a Narcotic Drug (25-48-4-1(c)(1)) Level 4 Felony
- Possession of Cocaine or a Narcotic Drug (35-48-4-6(a)) Level 6 Felony
- Operating While Intoxicated (9-30-5-2(b)) Class A Misdemeanor
- Public Intoxication (7.1-5-1-3(a)(1)) Class B Misdemeanor

Deputy Lockwood and I later carefully unfolded the other dollar bills and all but one contained a white powdery substance, similar to the one that had already field tested positive for cocaine. Myself and Deputy Lockwood tested each grouping of the white powdery substance on each dollar bill using Nartec Inc. Cocaine Test ampules and each returned a positive blue color after being touched to the substance. Deputy Lockwood tested one of the small baggies of a white substance with a 904 Reagent for Cocaine Salts and Base test. It returned a blue color after being exposed to the white substance, indicating that it had field tested positive for cocaine. The other small baggie's white substance was tested with a Nartec Inc. Cocaine Test ampule and it returned a positive blue color after being touched to the substance. A WeighMax scale was used to measure the total weight of the presumed cocaine. The total presumed cocaine weighed 1.86 grams. It is a reasonable assumption to believe that since Mr. Renfro Jr.

had seven separate and individually wrapped dollar bills and baggies containing cocaine and was traveling with these items on the interstate, Mr. Renfro had the intent to deliver cocaine to another person or persons. The cocaine was placed into a Henry County Sheriff's Office drug storage locker.

Nothing further at this time.
